

This contribution entitles a signatory to advanced engagement and leadership opportunities within the PRME community. 	A blood donation occurs when a person voluntarily has blood drawn and used for transfusions and/or made into biopharmaceutical medications by a process called fractionation (separation of whole blood components). Donation may be of whole blood, or of specific components directly (apheresis). Blood banks often participate in the collection process as well as the procedures that follow it.			
	Today in the developed world, most blood donors are unpaid volunteers who donate blood for a community supply. In some countries, established supplies are limited and donors usually give blood when family or friends need a transfusion (directed donation). Many donors donate for several reasons, such as a form of charity, general awareness regarding the demand for blood, increased confidence in oneself, helping a personal friend or relative, and social pressure. Despite the many reasons that people donate, not enough potential donors actively donate. However, this is reversed during disasters when blood donations increase, often creating an excess supply that will have to be later discarded. In countries that allow paid donation some people are paid, and in some cases there are incentives other than money such as paid time off from work. People can also have blood drawn for their own future use (autologous donation). Donating is relatively safe, but some donors have bruising where the needle is inserted or may feel faint.			
	Potential donors are evaluated for anything that might make their blood unsafe to use. The screening includes testing for diseases that can be transmitted by a blood transfusion, including HIV and viral hepatitis. The donor must also answer questions about medical history and take a short physical examination to make sure the donation is not hazardous to his or her health. How often a donor can donate varies from days to months based on what component they donate and the laws of the country where the donation takes place. For example, in the United States, donors must wait 56 days (eight weeks) between whole-blood donations but only seven days between platelet apheresis donations[1] and twice per sevenday period in plasmapheresis.			
	The amount of blood drawn and the methods vary. The collection can be done manually or with automated equipment that takes only specific components of the blood. Most of the components of blood used for transfusions have a short shelf life, and maintaining a constant supply is a persistent problem. This has led to some increased interest in autotransfusion, whereby a patient's blood is salvaged during surgery for continuous reinfusion—or alternatively, is self-donated prior to when it will be needed. Generally, the notion of donation does not refer to giving to one's self, though in this context it has become somewhat acceptably idiomatic.

Fostering Entrepreneurship - Strengthening and Improving the Existing Entrepreneurs: A Project Proposal

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

1. Beneficiary

The MSME is narrated as any enterprise involved in developing or manufacturing, processing and / or conservation of goods with the investments in Plant and also Machinery on its original (capital) cost leaving behind the land cost and building cost. Further, the investment in P& M is restricted to not exceeding Rs.25.00 lacs in case of Micro enterprises, not exceeding Rs.500.00 lacs in case of small enterprises and not exceeding Rs.1000.00 lacs for medium enterprises. In the service enterprises, the ceiling is restricted to Rs.10.00 lacs in case of micro, Rs.200.00 lacs in case of small and Rs.500.00 lacs in case of medium enterprises. The beneficiaries of this proposed project are the members of Madurai District Tiny & Small Scale Industries Association (MADITSSIA). Society as a whole will benefit from the resulting increase in entrepreneurship, competitiveness, wealth and employment.

2. Cluster background

Having good connectivity in all respects, there is ample scope for all kinds of industries like Automobile, Chemical, Agro based, Textile, Logistics, Information Technology, Energy etc. in Madurai. Madurai is the second largest city by area in Tamilnadu after Chennai. It is an important industrial and educational hub in South Tamil Nadu. Madurai is one of the few rubber growing areas in South India, and there are rubberbased industries in Madurai. Gloves, sporting goods, mats, other utility products and automobile rubber components are the most produced items by these industries. Automobile manufacturers are the major consumers of rubber components produced in the city. There are numerous textile, granite and chemical industries operating in Madurai.

It has developed as a second-tier city for information technology (IT), and some software companies have opened offices in Madurai. There are around 63 mil enterprises roughly contributing 8 % of India's GDP. Being the 3rd largest country for start-ups it has generated around 110 mil jobs over the years.

Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) sector plays a crucial role in Indian economy; the sector is highly dynamic and vibrant. The share of MSME Sector in the country's Gross Value Added (GVA) is approximately 32 per cent. Tamilnadu is a significant contributor to the Indian economy after Maharashtra. Tamil Nadu ranks third in total numbers of MSME units in India and it has generated 113.7 mil jobs for the state.

As per the Udyog Aadhaar registrations Madurai is one of the leading districts in number of MSMEs which are active. These MSMEs have a strong presence in engineering, automobile production, auto components manufacturing, agro based, food processing and information technology sector.

A recent article in "The Hindu" newspapers points out 3 major reasons for the slump in the MSME sector, especially to industries in and around Madurai

- 1. The GST regime and the economic slowdown
- 2. Weak demand and supply of raw materials from China
- 3. The COVID 19 conditions.

II. PROJECT OBJECTIVES & BRIEF RESULTS

1. Introduction

Despite the rising importance of the MSME sector in the Indian economy, the sector is grappling with several issues that are hindering it from performing to its optimum. The most pressing problem facing the country is unemployment. SMEs are universally recognised as significant generators of jobs and play a particularly significant role in relation to enhancing the competitiveness and productivity of the country. In order to realise greater employment opportunities, the dynamism of the SMEs sector and a higher level of entrepreneurship must be stimulated in the country. Amid fears of a slowdown, cut in jobs in various industries and rising unemployment, the MSME sector can play a big role, if aided and supported ably by the government as well as others.

2. Overall Purpose

The overall purpose of this project is to understand the problems identified by the selected entrepreneurs and to create intervention strategies to help them grow. Later these findings can be used to create a supporting mechanism for the entrepreneurs associated with MADITSSIA. We believe these activities can help the cluster to become more competitive and reduce unemployment.

Specific objectives

The main objectives of this project are:

- 1. To understand the problems faced by the entrepreneurs and
- 2. To facilitate research projects to identify the root causes for these problems

3. To suggest and implement strategies to overcome these problems faced by the entrepreneur.

3. Major Findings of the Study

The following are the major findings identified after a brief qualitative study carried out by the faculty of Thiagarajar School of Management and MADITSSIA

- 1. Lack of adequate and timely access to finance Many of the entrepreneurs interviewed face problem in getting timely access to finance. Huge outstanding from customers, accessibility for finance from funding agencies and banks & improper handling/lack of knowledge in handling finance are the major reasons for this.
- 2. **Technology upgradation** this can be classified in to 3 parts where first being the financial restrictions to upgrade the technology, second is the lack of awareness and third is the lack of motivation due to family or business conditions.
- **3. Branding and marketing** is one of the biggest and widest problem faced by the entrepreneurs. Most of them face lack of proper support in branding and marketing their products and services. Another common pattern is that, many of these entrepreneurs overlook branding efforts because they think of themselves as a business and not a brand. Lacking Awareness, use of traditional methods to tap markets, lack of support are the major causes.
- 4. Succession and Continuity of Business Many of these businesses are managed by family members and the children of these entrepreneurs/family members are not ready to get into the business. The lack of succession planning is common with majority of the entrepreneurs we have interviewed.
- 5. Financial management and Business Plan Managing accounts and handling finances is another major issue facing entrepreneurs. Although many of them are

satisfied with the basic financial situation of the business, they always want external support to manage their finances. This also applies to business plans. For many of them, there is no clear value proposition or future plans. A clear roadmap can help them take their business to a new level.

- 6. Management Information System Managing and capturing data is not proper which causes further problems related to inventory management, finance management, customers and supplier management etc., We can say that this lack of awareness and lack of system in place to capture the data.
- 7. Operations For few entrepreneurs there is problem in managing the operations part of the business. Improper inventory management results in mismanaging the delivery to the customers; this results in loss of customers to financial losses in the business. One problem which can be attributed is the lack on second in line managers in the business. Since these businesses are managed by owner managers their presence is needed at all the time. Though some entrepreneurs are able to find second in line managers not all the entrepreneurs are lucky enough to find skilled people. Retaining them and skilled employees also becomes difficult for some entrepreneurs which is a potential **Human Resource Management** problem.
- 8. Handholding the business for new entrepreneurs and support for existing businesses like raw material availability/market, marketing support, easy movement of goods and services etc., While all these business seems to have different problems, we can say that almost all the entrepreneurs faced all these problems at one point in their business. Some of them were able to manage based on their skill, some did it in trial and error method and others could not find a suitable solution. In a broad sense, we can say that these entrepreneurs need to be supported at different points in their business and there should be an eco-system to support the activities.

"In an ecosystem of finite resources there can only be Finite Consumption, In an ecosystem of finite resources there has to be Distributed Production" Limit your Consumption & Localize your Production, when applied to Energy, it becomes Energy Swaraj, said Dr. Chetan Singh Solanki in his lecture to students at Thiagarajar School of Management. CO2 is garbage of atmosphere and the average middle class family throws about 400 to 600 kg CO2/month, once emitted, average life of CO2 is 300 years leading to global warming. Our Planet is warmer by 1.1 ° C or 1.98 ° F causing severe climate change, sudden floods, forest fires, sea level rise, heat waves, storms and hurricanes , in order to reduce natural disasters like these we need to limit global warming to ideally, 1.5 ° C . As a whole we need DRASTIC and IMMEDIATE changes in energy use pattern, switching to 100% solar energy is a solution. Dr. Chetan Singh Solanki's 3-Step Approach - for switching to 100% on solar energy: Avoid - Avoid the use of energy, by 1/3rd or as much as possible. Minimize - Minimize the use of energy, by 1/3rd or as much as possible. Generate -Generate energy locally by 1/3rd or as little energy as possible after following avoid and minimize step 		
	Dr. Chetan Singh Solanki also referred as "Solar Man of India" or "Solar Gandhi" and his team, have travelled 19,500 km across India and it is an honour to have him in Madurai on 501th day of his Energy Swaraj mission. College students from 6 districts attended the program organized by Thiagarajar School of Management, Madurai, Tamil Nadu. In his "Energy, Climate Change & I" – Lecture Dr. Chetan Solanki said the solution lies with both Individual and Institutional initiatives to create Energy Independency as public movement, and to lead Energy Swaraj!


